REBELS RECAP:

Tue. Feb. 7 – Ben King scored twice on the power play and added the shootout winner to give the Rebels a 5-4 win over the Portland Winterhawks at Veterans Memorial Coliseum. Jace Isley scored his league leading sixth shorthanded goal of the year. Craig Armstrong also scored in period two for the Rebels while Kai Uchacz also scored in the shootout. Kyle Kelsey picked up the win between the pipes. Portland outshot Red Deer 39-33 on the night and was 1-for-3 on the power play while Red Deer was 2-for-4.

Sun. Feb. 5 – Frantisek Formanek and Ben King each scored once as the Rebels fell 4-2 to the Everett Silvertips at the Angel of the Winds Arena. Rhett Stoesser made 33 saves for Red Deer as the Silvertips outshot the Rebels 37-24. Red Deer was 1-for-2 on the power play while Everett was 1-for-4.

Sat. Feb. 4 – Ben King scored the lone goal of the shootout, and the game, as the Rebels kicked off their U.S. Division road trip with a 1-0 win over the Spokane Chiefs. Dawson Cowan was superb for Spokane in making 45 saves. Kyle Kelsey earned his second shutout of the season for Red Deer with a 26-save performance. Red Deer was 0-for-2 on the power play while Spokane was 0-for-3.

Tue. Jan. 31 – Jhett Larson was the overtime hero as the Rebels won a thrilling 6-5 decision over the visiting Regina Pats in front of a sold-out crowd at the Peavey Mart Centrium. Ben King scored twice for Red Deer. Kai Uchacz, Jayden Grubbe, and Craig Armstrong each scored once. Rhett Stoesser earned his team leading 18th win of the season. Red Deer outshot Regina 32-22 and was 1-for-4 on the power play while Regina was 2-for-4.

Sat. Jan. 28 – The Winnipeg ICE, the top ranked team in the Canadian Hockey League, defeated the Rebels 5-1 at the Peavey Mart Centrium. Mats Lindgren scored on a power play in the second period for Red Deer. Winnipeg outshot Red Deer 38-26 and was 2-for-5 on the power play while Red Deer was 1-for-5.

Fri. Jan. 27 – The Rebels earned a 5-1 win over the visiting Saskatoon Blades at the Peavey Mart Centrium. Kai Uchacz led the way once again with two goals and an assist. Frantisek Formanek had three assists. Kalan Lind, Dwayne Jean Jr. and Ben King (power play) also scored. Christoffer Sedoff and Hunter Mayo each had two assists. Kyle Kelsey turned in a superb 34-save performance. Saskatoon outshot Red Deer 35-27 and was 0-for-3 on the power play while Red Deer was 1-for-2.

VERSUS THE THUNDERBIRDS: The last meeting between the Rebels and Thunderbirds took place October 25, 2019 at the Peavey Mart Centrium in Red Deer where Seattle won 5-4. Christoffer Sedoff scored for Red Deer while Jayden Grubbe had an assist. They are the only current Rebels who played for Red Deer in that game. Kai Uchacz played that night as a member of the Thunderbirds.

Red Deer's last win over Seattle was on November 3, 2015, at the Peavey Mart Centrium by a score of 4-3. The Thunderbirds have won the last four meetings between the two clubs.

The last time the Rebels visited the accesso ShoWare Center was back on February 15, 2019, when Seattle won by a score of 6-4. Brandon Hagel had three assists for Red Deer. Red Deer's last win in Seattle was on February 8, 2013, by a score of 6-3. Since then, the Rebels are 0-2-0-1 at the accesso ShoWare Center.

ON THE RADAR

The Rebels have three players on the NHL Central Scouting Midterm Rankings for the 2023 NHL Draft – Kalan Kind (F, '05) 23rd North American Skaters, Kai Uchacz (F, '04) 130th, Matteo Fabrizi (D, '05) 215th.

Lind played for Team White at the 2023 Kubota CHL/NHL Top Prospects Game, January 25 in Langley, BC. The 18-year-old from Shaunavon, SK was the Rebels' 1st round pick (6th overall) at the 2020 WHL Prospects Draft. He won gold with Team Canada at the 2022 Hlinka Gretzky Cup held at the Peavey Mart Centrium in Red Deer, July 31-August 6, and played at the Capital City Challenge in Ottawa in November 2021.

SINGING A NEW TUNE

On Thursday, January 5, the Rebels acquired 2005-born forward Ryker Singer from Prince George in exchange for 2005-born forward Arjun Bawa, a 2nd round selection at the 2023 WHL Prospects Draft, and a 7th round selection at the 2023 WHL Draft. Singer was selected by the Cougars in round one, 22nd overall, at the 2020 WHL Prospects Draft. In 95 career games, he has nine goals and 11 assists for 20 points.

BLUE LINE BOLSTER

On Tuesday, January 10, the Rebels acquired 2004-born defenceman Nicholas Andrusiak from the Portland Winterhawks in exchange for a seventh-round selection at the 2024 WHL Prospects Draft. Signed by Portland in September 2021, Andrusiak has appeared in two games with the Winterhawks during the 2022-23 WHL Regular Season. The left-shooting blue liner from Tisdale, Saskatchewan had three points in 20 games this season with the Melville Millionaires (SJHL).

BEST START EVER

The Rebels set new franchise records for best start to a season and longest win streak by winning 15 consecutive games to begin the 2022-23 WHL Regular Season. The 2000-01 Rebels team won their first seven games enroute to winning the Memorial Cup. The following year in 2001-02, the Rebels won 14 consecutive games in Jan-Feb.

RECORD-SETTING CROWD

The Rebels set a regular season franchise attendance record when 7,287 fans turned out to the Peavey Mart Centrium on January 31, 2023, to watch the club take on Connor Bedard and the Regina Pats. The previous record of 7,208 was set on March 19, 2016, when the Rebels hosted the Edmonton Oil Kings.

CENTURY CLUB (TIMES TWO)

Forward Ben King scored his 100th career goal Feb. 7, 2023, at Portland. It was also King's 220th career game. He has 92 goals as a member of the Red Deer Rebels, good for 6th on the team's all-time list. The Vernon, BC native sits 11th on the team's all-time points list with 191.

With three assists versus the Edmonton Oil Kings on Nov. 15, 2022, Christoffer Sedoff ('02) became the 14th defenceman in Red Deer Rebels history to record 100 career points. Sedoff is the first Rebels rearguard to reach the century mark since Alexander Alexeyev in 2019. With an assist at Edmonton on December 30, he became the 20th player and sixth defenceman to record 100 helpers with the Rebels.

COBRA KAI

Rebels centre Kai Uchacz was named to the CHL Team of the Month for December after registering 12 goals and six assists for 18 points and a +5 rating in 10 games. He was also named WHL Player of the Week for the week ending January 1, 2023, after he netted 10 goals and one assist in four games, including three hat tricks.

TOP NOTCH TANDEM

Rebels netminders Kyle Kelsey and Rhett Stoesser were named the WHL Goaltenders of the Month for September and October. The two rookies helped Red Deer start the 2022-23 WHL Regular Season with 13 consecutive victories, surrendering only 22 goals in 13 contests. Kelsey ('04), who hails from Maple Ridge, B.C., posted a 1.87 goals-against average and .936 save percentage over his eight appearances in September and October, including a 26-save shutout of the Lethbridge Hurricanes October 8. Kelsey was also named to the CHL Team of the Month for October. Stoesser ('05), from Carstairs, AB, earned two shutouts in October, blanking the Prince Albert Raiders with 23 saves effort October 22 and the Vancouver Giants with 18 saves October 28. Kelsey was originally selected by Moose Jaw in the fifth round of the 2019 WHL Draft and acquired by the Rebels in May 2022. Stoesser was a free agent signing in September.

CANADA CALLING

Two Rebels were selected to play at the 2022 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge in Langley and Delta, B.C. Centre Ollie Josephson ('06) was selected in the first round, fifth overall by the Rebels at the 2021 WHL Prospects Draft last December. Goaltender Chase Wutzke ('06) was selected in round two, 40th overall by the Rebels in 2021 appeared in three regular season games with the club last season, going 2-0-1-0. A native of Debden, SK, Wutzke is with the Saskatoon Contacts U18 AAA of the SMAAAHL this season. Josephson was selected to play for Canada White did not take part due to injury. Wutzke played for Canada Red, winning silver, and posted a 24-save shutout versus Czechia on Nov. 5.

CANADA WINTER GAMES

Four Red Deer Rebels prospects have been selected to represent their province at the 2023 Canada Winter Games in Prince Edward Island in February. Defenceman Luke Vlooswyk, Red Deer's 17th overall pick at the 2022 WHL Prospects Draft, will play for Team Alberta, while Forward Matthew Gard (Round 2, 39th) and defencemen Tate Dolinsky (Round 4, 69th) and Reece Gault (Round 5, 105th) will play for Team Manitoba. Current Rebels who played at the 2019 Canada Winter Games in Red Deer include forwards Jayden Grubbe and Kai Uchacz for Team Alberta, and defenceman Marek Schneider for Team Saskatchewan.

LAST GAME: Jared Davidson had three assists as the Thunderbirds were 3-1 winners Sunday here against the Spokane Chiefs. Jeremy Hanzel, Brad Lambert and Kyle Crnkovic scored the goals for Seattle. Thomas Milic got the win in net with 20 saves as the Thunderbirds outshot the Chiefs 52-21.

SEASON SERIES: The last time the Thunderbirds and Rebels played each other was October 25th, 2019, at the Peavey Mart Centrum in Red Deer. Seattle won, 5-4, in a shootout. Current Thunderbirds Jared Davidson and Lucas Ciona were in the lineup that night with Davidson scoring a goal. Red Deer's last visit to Kent was February 15th, 2019, a 6-4 Seattle win. The Thunderbirds have won four straight games versus Red Deer dating back to the 2016-17 season. The Rebels last win over Seattle was November 3rd, 2015, when they prevailed 4-3 in Red Deer.

KONO RETURNS: Steve Konowalchuk makes his first return to the accesso ShoWare Center as an opposing coach tonight. Konowalchuk was the head coach of the Thunderbirds from 2011 to 2017. He was behind the bench when Seattle captured the 2017 WHL Championship. In his six seasons as Thunderbirds head coach, he compiled a regular season record of 218-176-37 and was 38-22 in the postseason. Konowalchuk left the Thunderbirds after their 2017 championship season. He was named head coach of Red Deer in June of 2021.

NO O'DETTE OWED: Current Thunderbirds head coach Matt O'Dette served as Steve Konowalchuk's assistant from 2013-2017 before being named Konowalchuk's successor in July of 2017. O'Dette is currently in his sixth season as Seattle's head coach. His coaching record with the Thunderbirds is 179-127-34. He has a 17-19 postseason record.

NHL CENTRAL SCOUTING: Five Thunderbirds made Central Scouting's midterm rankings for the upcoming NHL Draft. Among North American skaters, Gracyn Sawchyn was ranked 42nd, Nico Myatovic was #47 and Sawyer Mynio was #111. Among North American goalies, Scott Ratzlaff was ranked #6 and Thomas Milic was #25.

ONE LAST TIME: Tonight's game against Red Deer marks the Thunderbirds final game this regular season against a team from the Eastern Conference. Seattle went 3-3-0-0 versus the Eastern Division and enters tonight's game with a 4-0-1-0 mark against the Central Division.

DID YOU KNOW: Gracyn Sawchyn was originally drafted by the Red Deer Rebels. He was the first overall pick in the inaugural WHL U.S. Priority Draft in 2020. The Thunderbirds acquired his rights in May of 2021 in exchange for a second round pick in the WHL Prospects Draft. Red Deer's Kai Uchacz was Seattle's first selection in the 2018 WHL Prospects Draft (10th overall). Seattle traded Uchacz to the Rebels for a 2nd round pick in the 2021 WHL Prospects Draft.

JUST DYLAN TIME: Last Sunday the NHL's Arizona Coyotes reassigned Dylan Guenther to the Thunderbirds. Guenther was selected in the first round (9th overall) by the Coyotes in the 2021 NHL Draft. Seattle acquired his rights from the Edmonton Oil Kings at the WHL trade deadline, January 10th.

HE'S A OKAY: Kevin Korchinski has 122 assists in 125 career WHL games, including 16 helpers in thirteen games since returning from 2023 IIHF World Juniors early this month.

MILESTONE ALERT: Jared Davidson is six points shy of 200 points as a Thunderbird. He needs two more goals to reach 90. Tonight, is Lucas Ciona's 175 game in the WHL. Reid Schaefer is four points from 100 in the WHL.

NEXT GAME: It's a quick turnaround for Seattle as they head south to Portland to face the Winterhawks tomorrow night at the Veterans Memorial Coliseum. Game time is 6:00 p.m. The Thunderbirds next home game is next Tuesday when they host the Tri-City Americans at 7:05 p.m.
