BEDARD MEETS BRANDON FOR FINAL SKATE INSIDE HUB

REGINA – Connor Bedard takes to the ice for the final time inside the Brandt Centre this season, as the WHL’s top rookie leads the Pats into a Friday matinee (4 p.m.) with the division-leading Brandon Wheat Kings.

Bedard will head home Saturday to begin quarantine protocols for his upcoming stint with Hockey Canada at the IIHF U18 World Championship in Texas (April 26 – May 6). It’s been a challenging couple of days for Regina’s standout 15-year-old after the tragic passing of his grandfather on Tuesday.

The WHL’s first player granted exceptional status, Bedard is looking for one more stellar night inside the Hub. He enters the day one point back of Winnipeg’s Peyton Krebs for the league lead in points (26). Bedard is coming off his second four-point outing of the season after a 6-1 win over the Swift Current Broncos Tuesday, which saw him register a pair of goals and assists.

Brandon skates into the afternoon as the top team in the division, riding an eight-game winning streak dating back to March 24. The Wheat Kings most recent victory also came against the Broncos, 4-1 on Wednesday.

This one marks the third meeting of the season between the Pats and Wheat Kings, with Brandon having won both previous matchups.

BY THE NUMBERS

- Ryker Evans is **second** in WHL defencemen scoring with **15 points in 14 games**. Evan’s point/game production (**1.07**) is more than double what it was last season when he averaged **0.49 pts/game (31 points in 63 games)**
- Regina’s penalty kill is **7-for-8** this season against Brandon. Only Saskatoon’s has been better against the Wheaties (**12-for-12**).
- Bedard is **one of two** players who will be leaving the Subway WHL Hub and heading to play for Canada at the U18s along with PA Raider Nolan Allan.
- Brandon has been dominant over their current **eight-game** winning streak. The Wheat Kings have outscored their opponents a combined **41-to-14**.

TEAM HISTORY

Founded in 1917 as the Regina Patricia Hockey Club, the Regina Pats have been a Queen City tradition for more than a century.

Named for the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry, the Pats are the oldest major junior hockey franchise in the world.

The Pats are proud members of the Western Hockey League, having won WHL championships in 1974 and 1980. Along with these league championships, the Pats are four-time Memorial Cup champions, with victories in 1925, 1928 (as the Regina Monarchs), 1930, and 1974.

The Pats storied connection with the Memorial Cup owes both to the club's four championships, along with Regina's proud tradition of hosting the event. The Memorial Cup has been staged — at least in part — seven times in the Queen City (shared in 1947, 1957, 1969, 1980 and solely in 1950, 2001 and 2018). The 2018 edition celebrated the centennial of both the Memorial Cup and Pats.

More than 160 Pats have gone on to play in the National Hockey League, including current NHLers Sam Steel (Anaheim Ducks | Pats 2014-18), Austin Wagner (LA Kings | Pats 2013-17), and Jordan Eberle (NY Islanders | Pats 2006-10).
