Tonight: The Saskatoon Blades are in Manitoba for the third meeting of the season against the Winnipeg ICE. This is the first of back-to-back matches at Wayne Fleming Arena, with Saturday's closer set for 7:00pm. The Blades are coming off a three-game trip though Alberta last weekend which began with a 3-1 victory in Red Deer, followed by back to back regulation losses in Calgary and Edmonton. These two-games in Winnipeg wrap up a stretch of nine-straight matches away from home for Saskatoon. So far, the Blades have gone 2-5-0-0 on this stretch. They'll return to SaskTel Centre for the first time since November 9th next Friday, December 10th against the Calgary Hitmen.

Tale of the Tape: This is the third of eight meetings between the two divisional rivals. Winnipeg topped Saskatoon at the Wayne Fleming Arena in the two previous contests — 4-1 on November 13th, followed by a 6-0 decision the following night. Team-leading scorer Tristen Robins has the only goal for Saskatoon against the ICE this season, which came late in the second period on the powerplay to tie the game 1-1. Tonight's battle also pins the two best powerplay clips against one-another, proving discipline is sure to be key for both squads. Winnipeg sits alone at the top with a 38.8% success rate, with Saskatoon sitting second at 25.8%. Over the last five years, Saskatoon has gone 5-8-2-0 against Winnipeg, with three of those victories coming on the road.

Who to watch: Forward Trevor Wong led the Blades in scoring with three goals and two assists in last weekend's three-game trip through Alberta. This includes scoring the opening marker, and game-winner against Red Deer in a 3-1 victory. The Vancouver, BC product has equaled his career high in goals with six on the campaign, which is fifth highest on the team. Defenceman Tanner Molendyk has returned to the Blades after capturing gold for Team Canada Black U17 at the Capital City Challenge. The McBride, BC product notched one assist in all five games to give him a tournament-total of five points. Alternate captain Kyle Crnkovic notched his team-leading 12th goal of the season last Sunday in Edmonton; part of a four-point weekend for the Chestermere, AB product. The 2002-born sniper has led the Blades in shots on goal all season long, now up to 81 on the year, and has multi-point performances in two of his last three games.

Saves for Hunger... This season, The Saskatoon Blades have partnered with Nutrien to launch the "Saves for Hunger" Campaign. For every save a Blades netminder makes this season, Nutrien is donating \$5 to a local organization. Blades goaltenders have made a combined 643 saves so far, running the tally up to \$3215 raised as the team heads into Winnipeg.









Belarus is Calling: Import forward Egor Sidorov has linked up with his fellow countrymen ahead of the 2022 IIHF World Junior Division 1A Championship, which will run December 12-18th in Denmark. The Blades 1st round selection from the 2021 CHL Import Draft leads the team in rookie scoring with 13 points (7G-6A) in 22 games. This is Sidorov's second time representing Belarus, following his impressive performance at the 2021 Under-18 World Championship which saw him collect a team-leading five assists in five games.

Mini Shark... Alternate captain Tristen Robins is the only Blade drafted into the NHL, and enters his final season in the WHL with plenty of pro experience. The Clear Lake, MB product spent nearly two weeks with the San Jose Sharks ahead of the season and currently sits 4th in league in scoring with 29 points. Robins leads the team in game winning goals (3) this season — one of which in overtime to Edmonton on Nov. 9.

Higher for Maier... Veteran goaltender Nolan Maier recorded his franchise record 100th career victory last month, stopping 46 shots in a 2-1 victory over the Brandon Wheat Kings on Nov. 12 to open the Blades ninegame stint on the road. The Yorkton, SK product eclipsed Tim Cheveldae's franchise record of 85 victories last season, and continues to build on his own record, now sitting at 101 — 19 back of the league record of 120.
