Tonight: The Saskatoon Blades face elimination for a second consecutive game as they head to Moose Jaw to face the Warriors in Game 5. The Blades are coming off a critical 5-3 victory to stay alive in Game 4 on Wednesday, led by alternate captain Rhett Rhinehart's two-point performance, and a 32 save performance from Nolan Maier. It was do-or-die Wednesday; now the Blades are hoping to come away with another victory to force Game 6 at SaskTel Centre. Moose Jaw rattled off three straight wins to open the series, including back-toback victories on home ice last weekend, and a 3-2 overtime win in Game 3 in Saskatoon. If necessary, Game 7 will take place at Mosaic Place next Tuesday.

Tale of the Tape: The Warriors jumped to a commanding lead in the series with three straight wins, but couldn't get the job done Wednesday night in Saskatoon. The Blades erupted for a pair of goals in the first period, and despite allowing Moose Jaw to climb out of a two-goal deficit in the second, veteran defender Rhett Rhinehart sealed the deal with the game-winner midway through the third. Fellow alternate captain Kyle Crnkovic added a pair of goals, while Maier picked up his first win of this year's playoffs. Saskatoon heads back into Moose Jaw for Game 5 — a location they failed to secure a win in the first two games of the series. However, the Blades carry momentum into the stanza, not only winning Game 4, but also taking the regular season series in commanding fashion going 6-2-0-0.

Who to watch: Alternate captain Rhett Rhinehart is playing out his final games in the WHL, and is coming off a two-point performance Wednesday night in Saskatoon. The lumbering defender notched his first career playoff goal midway through the third period; the eventual game winner, to send the series back to Moose Jaw. The 6-foot-4 workhorse is up to four goals in four playoff games.











Alternate captain **Kyle Crnkovic** notched a pair of goals in Saskatoon's Game 4 victory, including a timely marker late in the first to give the Blades a 2-0 lead. The 2002-born winger is up to four points this series, and is coming off a sensational regular season capturing 94 points in 68 games.

Draft-eligible forward **Brandon Lisowsky** sits tied for the team-lead in scoring with four points (3G-1A) in the playoffs. The former first round pick by Saskatoon recorded his first two career playoff goals in Saskatoon's most recent trip to Moose Jaw. Ranked inside the top 90 in NHL Central Scouting's midterm rankings, the Port Coquitlam, BC product recorded 33 goals in 68 regular season games this year.

Grea73st of All Time: Veteran netminder Nolan Maier set a new record for most wins by a WHL goaltender on April 8th, securing his 121st victory of his career. The pending WHL graduate extended that record with a 2-1 victory over Brandon a week later to close out the season. Maier holds numerous team records as well, including game's played, victories, and shutouts.

Saves for Hunger: During the regular season, The Saskatoon Blades partnered with Nutrien to launch the "Saves for Hunger" Campaign. For every save a Blades netminder makes this season, Nutrien is donating \$5 to a local organization. Blades goaltenders made a combined 1942 saves over the course of 68 games, running the tally up to \$9710 going straight back into the community.
