## GAME #18 VANCOUVER GIANTS VS PRINCE GEORGE COUGARS

**THE STORY SO FAR** – Heading into tonight’s game the Vancouver Giants are 10-7 and are ranked second in the B.C. Division standings. So far this season the Giants have earned at least one victory against every B.C. Division opponent, and they’ll be looking to secure their second straight victory when they clash with the Prince George Cougars tonight for the fifth time this season.

**THE MATCHUP** – Tonight the Vancouver Giants take the ice as the home team against their Northern foes, the Prince George Cougars. So far this season, the Giants are 2-2 against Prince George having earned a 1-0 shootout victory against them back on April 4<sup>th</sup> and then a 2-1 victory on April 19<sup>th</sup>. For the season, the Cougars have accumulated a record of 6-7-2-1. The Cougars have outscored the Giants in the season series 11-7, and forward Craig Armstrong has accounted for five of those goals – four of which came in one game. Eric Florchuk leads the Giants with four points (1G, 3A) against the Cougars.

**LAST GAME** – Last night in Kelowna, the Vancouver Giants earned a 5-4 shootout victory over the Victoria Royals. Tristen Nielsen and Justin Sourdif both scored in the shootout for the Giants while Connor Horning, Adam Hall, Alex Kannok Leipert and Kaden Kohle supplied goals in regulation for the Giants. Alex Kannok Leipert’s two-point outing was tops among Giants. In goal Drew Sim earned his fourth victory by turning aside 15 of Victoria’s 19 shots through 65 minutes, plus an additional two attempts in the shootout.

## **GAME #18 VANCOUVER GIANTS VS PRINCE GEORGE COUGARS**

**SOURDIF DRAFTED BY PANTHERS** – On October 7<sup>th</sup>, 2020 Giants forward Justin Sourdif was drafted by the Florida Panthers in Round 3 (87<sup>th</sup> Overall) in the 2020 NHL Draft. Sourdif, a product of Surrey, B.C. was originally selected third overall by the Giants in the 2017 WHL Bantam Draft. Since then he's appeared in 142 career regular season games with the Giants and has compiled 56 goals and 70 assists for 126 points along with 100 penalty minutes and a +65 rating. Additionally, Sourdif has suited up in 24 playoff games with Vancouver. Justin Sourdif is the second Giant to ever be selected by the Florida Panthers and is the 33<sup>rd</sup> Giants player to ever be drafted to the National Hockey League. The other Giant selected by Florida was Michal Repik in 2007. He is the 21<sup>st</sup> Giants forward to ever be drafted to the NHL. The Vancouver Giants have now had at least one player drafted in 16 of the past 19 years.

**MINER SHINES IN THE AHL** – Before returning to the Vancouver Giants to start the 2020-21 season, 2001-born goaltender Trent Miner got his first taste of pro hockey when he signed an Amateur Tryout Agreement with the AHL's Colorado Eagles. Miner, a seventh-round pick of the Colorado Avalanche from 2019 appeared in five games with the Eagles, posting a 2-3-1 record with a 2.86 goals-against-average, a .906 save percentage and one shutout. He's 6-6 so far this season and has four shutouts which ties him for the league lead.

**OSTAPCHUK ON THE RADAR** – 2003-born forward Zack Ostapchuk is the next Giant hoping to hear his name called at the NHL Draft. The product of St. Albert, AB is entering his second season after posting five goals and three assists for eight points in 44 games last season. He was originally selected 12<sup>th</sup> overall by the Giants in the 2018 WHL Bantam Draft. In January, Ostapchuk was one of 36 WHL players to crack NHL Central Scouting's Preliminary Players to Watch List. So far this season, Zack Ostapchuk has six goals and six assists for 12 points in 17 games. He leads the Giants with three game-winning goals.

**MICHAEL DYCK EARNS SILVER AT 2021 WORLD JUNIORS** – Vancouver Giants head coach Michael Dyck served as an assistant coach with Canada at the 2021 IIHF World Juniors which took place in Edmonton, AB. Despite a dominant performance from Canada through much of the tournament, they dropped the Gold Medal game to the United States by a 2-0 score on January 5<sup>th</sup>. Vancouver Giants alumnus Bowen Byram was also a part of Canada's World Junior team. Giants defenceman Marko Stacha also competed in the tournament for a second straight year as a representative of Slovakia.

**GIANTS ADD KEITH McCAMBRIDGE TO COACHING STAFF** – On November 13, 2020 the Vancouver Giants hired Keith McCambridge as their new associate coach. Keith McCambridge joins the Giants after spending 10 seasons coaching in the American Hockey League. During his AHL tenure, he served as head coach of the Hartford Wolf Pack (2017-2019), The Manitoba Moose (2015-16) and the St. John's IceCaps (2011-2015). Additionally, he spent six seasons with the ECHL's Alaska Aces where he served as a head coach (2007-2009), an assistant coach (2006-07) and a player/coach (2003-2006).

### **QUICK FACTS –**

- Justin Sourdif has eight multi-point games so far this season for Vancouver.
- The Vancouver Giants are the lone team in the WHL to have two different goalies earn a shutout victory this season.
- Mazden Leslie is tied for the B.C. Division lead in rookie goal scoring with five.
- Alex Kannok Leipert's six goals rank first among B.C. Division blueliners, and fourth in the entire WHL among D-Men.
