GAME #5 VANCOUVER GIANTS VS KAMLOOPS BLAZERS

THE STORY SO FAR – The Vancouver Giants are off to a 3-1 start in their young season. The Giants kicked off their 2020-21 campaign with a 7-3 loss Friday against Kamloops, but have stormed back in a big way since with three straight wins against Kelowna, Victoria and Prince George. On Sunday, March 28, Tristen Nielsen notched five points in a 6-0 Giants victory over the Rockets. Then on March 30th Eric Florchuk, Justin Sourdif and Tristen Nielsen combined for eight points as the G-Men earned a come-from-behind victory over the Victoria Royals. Last night Trent Miner made 14 saves to earn the shutout in a 1-0 shootout victory over the Prince George Cougars.

THE MATCHUP – Tonight marks the second of six meetings on the season between the Vancouver Giants and the Kamloops Blazers. So far this season the Vancouver Giants are 0-1 having dropped a 7-3 decision to Kamloops on March 26th. Tristen Nielsen had a goal and an assist that night for Vancouver while Matthew Seminoff (2G, 1A) and Connor Zary (3A) each had three points for the Kamloops Blazers. Last season the Giants were 3-4-1-0 against the Blazers and were 2-2 against them at home.

WHEELING AND 'NIELING' – Over-age forward Tristen Nielsen has exploded out of the gates for the Giants having secured five goals and four assists for nine points in a span of four games. He's picking up right where he left off last season when he led the Giants in both goals (30) and points (65). Nielsen has recorded a multi-point game in three of the past four games, and had the shootout winner last night against Prince George.

GAME #5 VANCOUVER GIANTS VS KAMLOOPS BLAZERS

SOURDIF DRAFTED BY PANTHERS – On October 7th, 2020 Giants forward Justin Sourdif was drafted by the Florida Panthers in Round 3 (87th Overall) in the 2020 NHL Draft. Sourdif, a product of Surrey, B.C. was originally selected third overall by the Giants in the 2017 WHL Bantam Draft. Since then he's appeared in 129 career regular season games with the Giants and has compiled 49 goals and 58 assists for 107 points along with 79 penalty minutes and a +62 rating. Additionally, Sourdif has suited up in 24 playoff games with Vancouver. Justin Sourdif is the second Giant to ever be selected by the Florida Panthers and is the 33rd Giants player to ever be drafted to the National Hockey League. The other Giant selected by Florida was Michal Repik in 2007. He is the 21st Giants forward to ever be drafted to the NHL. The Vancouver Giants have now had at least one player drafted in 16 of the past 19 years.

MINER SHINES IN THE AHL – Before returning to the Vancouver Giants to start the 2020-21 season, 2001-born goaltender Trent Miner got his first taste of pro hockey when he signed an Amateur Tryout Agreement with the AHL's Colorado Eagles. Miner, a seventh-round pick of the Colorado Avalanche from 2019 appeared in five games with the Eagles, posting a 2-3-1 record with a 2.86 goals-against-average, a .906 save percentage and one shutout. He's 2-0 so far with the G-Men this season.

OSTAPCHUK ON THE RADAR – 2003-born forward Zack Ostapchuk is the next Giant hoping to hear his name called at the NHL Draft. The product of St. Albert, AB is entering his second season with the Giants after posting five goals and three assists for eight points in 44 games last season. He was originally selected 10th overall by the Giants in the 2018 WHL Bantam Draft. In January, Ostapchuk was one of 36 WHL players to crack NHL Central Scouting's Preliminary Players to Watch List.

MICHAEL DYCK EARNS SILVER AT 2021 WORLD JUNIORS – Vancouver Giants head coach Michael Dyck served as an assistant coach with Canada at the 2021 IIHF World Juniors which took place in Edmonton, AB. Despite a dominant performance from Canada through much of the tournament, they dropped the Gold Medal game to the United States by a 2-0 score on January 5th. Vancouver Giants alumnus Bowen Byram was also a part of Canada's World Junior team. Giants defenceman Marko Stacha also competed in the tournament for a second straight year as a representative of Slovakia.

GIANTS ADD KEITH McCAMBRIDGE TO COACHING STAFF – On November 13, 2020 the Vancouver Giants hired Keith McCambridge as their new associate coach. Keith McCambridge joins the Giants after spending 10 seasons coaching in the American Hockey League. During his AHL tenure, he served as head coach of the Hartford Wolf Pack (2017-2019), The Manitoba Moose (2015-16) and the St. John's IceCaps (2011-2015). Additionally, he spent six seasons with the ECHL's Alaska Aces where he served as a head coach (2007-2009), an assistant coach (2006-07) and a player/coach (2003-2006).

QUICK FACTS –

- Justin Sourdif's next goal will mark the 50th of his WHL career.
- Giants captain Alex Kannok Leipert played in his 200th career WHL game tonight against Victoria.
- Mazden Leslie was the first under-aged Giant to score a goal since Dawson Holt scored in March, 2015.
- Tristen Nielsen was the first Giant to record five points in a game since Bowen Byram (2G, 3A) did so in January, 2018.
- Last night's 1-0 shootout victory marked the first time in the history of the franchise that they had won a 1-0 game via the shootout.
