## GAME #7 VANCOUVER GIANTS VS PRINCE GEORGE COUGARS

**THE STORY SO FAR** – The Vancouver Giants are off to a 5-1 start in their young season. Since opening the season with a loss to Kamloops on March 26<sup>th</sup> the Giants have since rattled off five consecutive victories. The winning streak started with a 6-0 victory over Kelowna on March 28<sup>th</sup>. Two nights later the Giants earned a 5-4 come-from-behind victory over the Victoria Royals. The streak extended to three straight wins on Sunday with a 1-0 shootout victory over Prince George, then Monday the Giants made it four straight wins with a 4-0 shutout victory over the Kamloops Blazers. On Wednesday the G-Men defeated Victoria 6-4 on the road in Kelowna. Tonight they square off with Prince George for a second time this season.

**THE MATCHUP** – Tonight marks the second of six meetings on the season between the Vancouver Giants and the Prince George Cougars. So far this season the Vancouver Giants are 1-0 against Prince George having earned a historic 1-0 shootout victory against the Cougars back on April 4<sup>th</sup>. That night Tristen Nielsen had the lone shootout goal for either side, and Trent Miner made 14 saves for the shutout. Last season the G-Men were 4-2-2-0 against Prince George.

**MINER'S HISTORIC RUN CONTINUES** – Giants goaltender Trent Miner became the Vancouver Giants all-time consecutive shutout record holder Wednesday thanks to spotless nine-save relief appearance. Dating back to March 6<sup>th</sup>, 2020 Trent Miner has gone 225 minutes and 48 without surrendering a goal against. The WHL record is 265 minutes and 13 seconds set by Flin Flon's Chris Worthy back in 1967-68.

## **GAME #7 VANCOUVER GIANTS VS PRINCE GEORGE**

**SOURDIF DRAFTED BY PANTHERS** – On October 7<sup>th</sup>, 2020 Giants forward Justin Sourdif was drafted by the Florida Panthers in Round 3 (87<sup>th</sup> Overall) in the 2020 NHL Draft. Sourdif, a product of Surrey, B.C. was originally selected third overall by the Giants in the 2017 WHL Bantam Draft. Since then he's appeared in 131 career regular season games with the Giants and has compiled 52 goals and 60 assists for 112 points along with 83 penalty minutes and a +65 rating. Additionally, Sourdif has suited up in 24 playoff games with Vancouver. Justin Sourdif is the second Giant to ever be selected by the Florida Panthers and is the 33<sup>rd</sup> Giants player to ever be drafted to the National Hockey League. The other Giant selected by Florida was Michal Repik in 2007. He is the 21<sup>st</sup> Giants forward to ever be drafted to the NHL. The Vancouver Giants have now had at least one player drafted in 16 of the past 19 years.

**MINER SHINES IN THE AHL** – Before returning to the Vancouver Giants to start the 2020-21 season, 2001-born goaltender Trent Miner got his first taste of pro hockey when he signed an Amateur Tryout Agreement with the AHL's Colorado Eagles. Miner, a seventh-round pick of the Colorado Avalanche from 2019 appeared in five games with the Eagles, posting a 2-3-1 record with a 2.86 goals-against-average, a .906 save percentage and one shutout. He's 4-0 so far with the G-Men this season and has three consecutive shutouts.

**OSTAPCHUK ON THE RADAR** – 2003-born forward Zack Ostapchuk is the next Giant hoping to hear his name called at the NHL Draft. The product of St. Albert, AB is entering his second season with the Giants after posting five goals and three assists for eight points in 44 games last season. He was originally selected 10<sup>th</sup> overall by the Giants in the 2018 WHL Bantam Draft. In January, Ostapchuk was one of 36 WHL players to crack NHL Central Scouting's Preliminary Players to Watch List.

**MICHAEL DYCK EARNS SILVER AT 2021 WORLD JUNIORS** – Vancouver Giants head coach Michael Dyck served as an assistant coach with Canada at the 2021 IIHF World Juniors which took place in Edmonton, AB. Despite a dominant performance from Canada through much of the tournament, they dropped the Gold Medal game to the United States by a 2-0 score on January 5<sup>th</sup>. Vancouver Giants alumnus Bowen Byram was also a part of Canada's World Junior team. Giants defenceman Marko Stacha also competed in the tournament for a second straight year as a representative of Slovakia.

**GIANTS ADD KEITH McCAMBRIDGE TO COACHING STAFF** – On November 13, 2020 the Vancouver Giants hired Keith McCambridge as their new associate coach. Keith McCambridge joins the Giants after spending 10 seasons coaching in the American Hockey League. During his AHL tenure, he served as head coach of the Hartford Wolf Pack (2017-2019), The Manitoba Moose (2015-16) and the St. John's IceCaps (2011-2015). Additionally, he spent six seasons with the ECHL's Alaska Aces where he served as a head coach (2007-2009), an assistant coach (2006-07) and a player/coach (2003-2006).

### **QUICK FACTS –**

- Justin Sourdif scored his 50<sup>th</sup> career WHL goal on Monday against Kamloops.
- Giants captain Alex Kannok Leipert played in his 200<sup>th</sup> career WHL game back on March 30<sup>th</sup> against Victoria.
- Mazden Leslie (March 28) was the first under-aged Giant to score a goal since Dawson Holt scored in March, 2015.
- Trent Miner is 39 minutes and 26 seconds away from setting a WHL record for the longest stretch of shutout hockey.
- Bryce Bader recorded his first career multi-point and multi-goal game during Wednesday's win against Victoria.
